



Today, we are celebrating the 149th Anniversary of the founding of First Baptist Church! A few distinct elements in the service are worth your attention. The seal stamped on your bulletin cover was imprinted by the original stamp given to us by the State of Colorado in 1873 once our incorporation was legally recognized. The hymn, “I Love Thy Kingdom, Lord,” that we’re singing this morning was sung by the congregation at the Sanctuary Dedication Service on October 25, 1891. Our historic bell will be rung to call us to worship. FBC’s Historian, Jean Fero, has compiled photos from past years to be on display for the month of September. The photos are located on the south side of the sanctuary, near the doors to the Historical Foyer. We are filled with gratitude that God has seen fit to keep us here on “Baptist Corner” all these years!
